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The Economic Cost of Road Traffic Crashes

Chart 1: Chart Illustrating War on Critical Offences

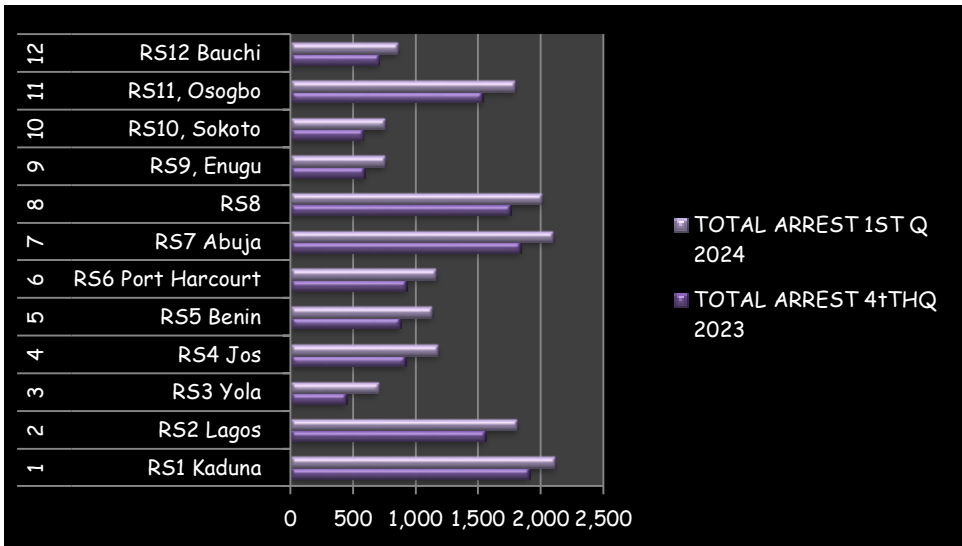
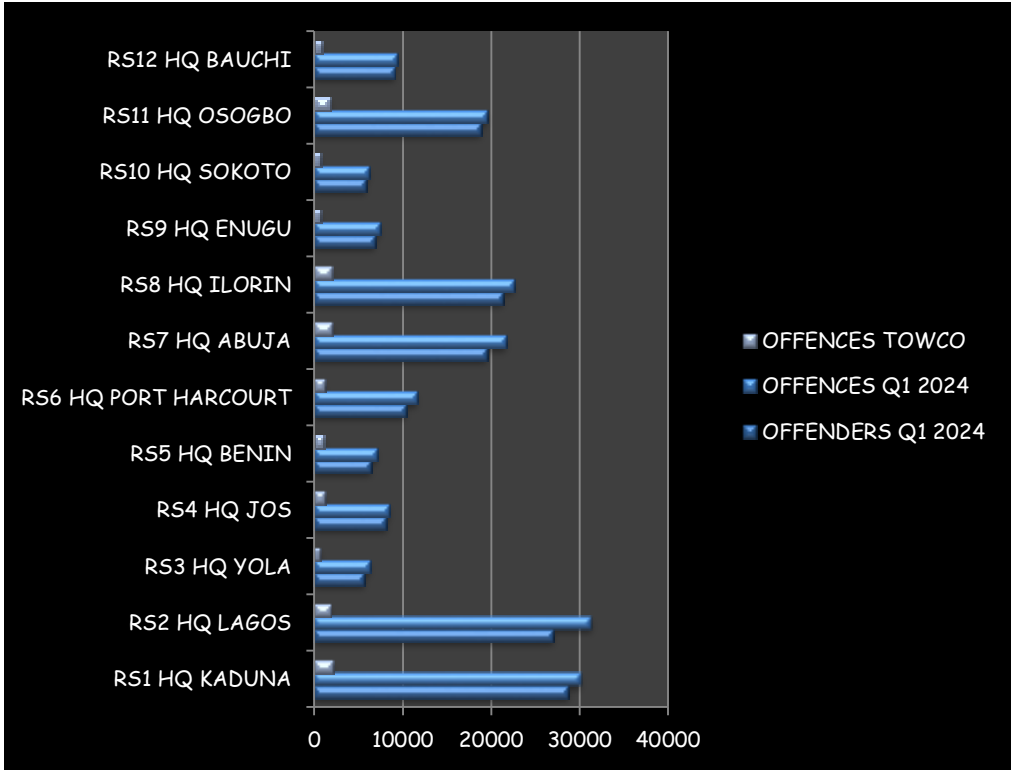

Chart 3: Chart Illustrating General Admin Activities Treated

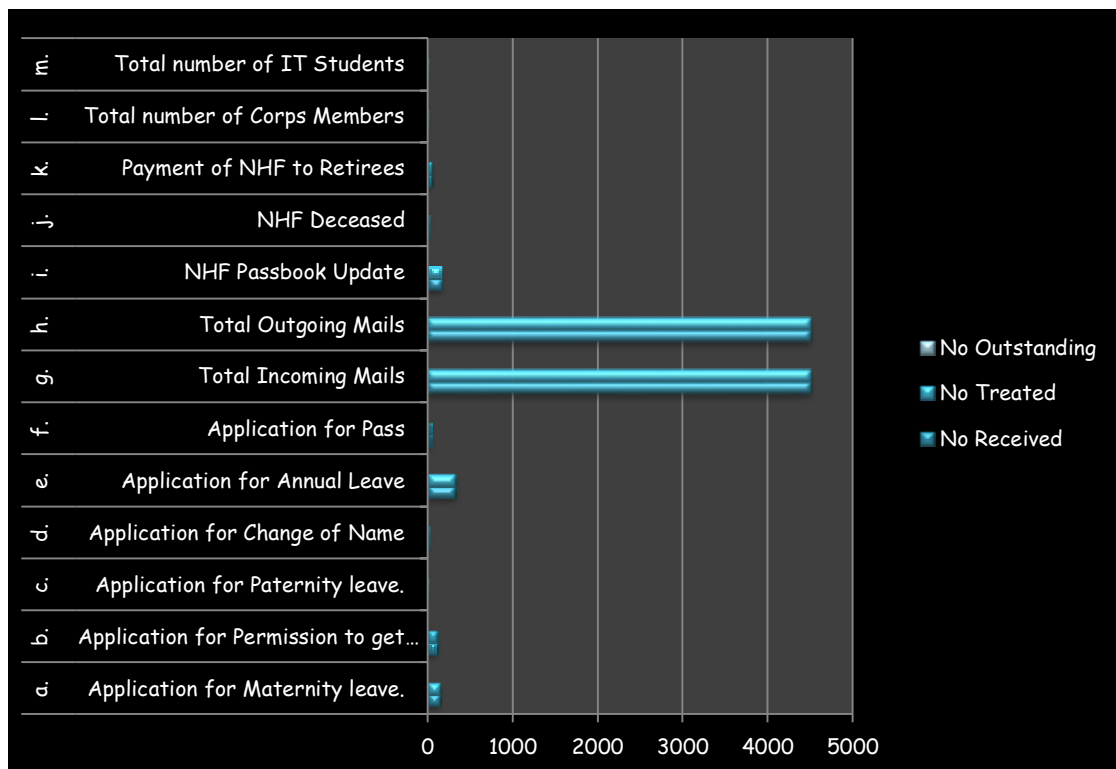
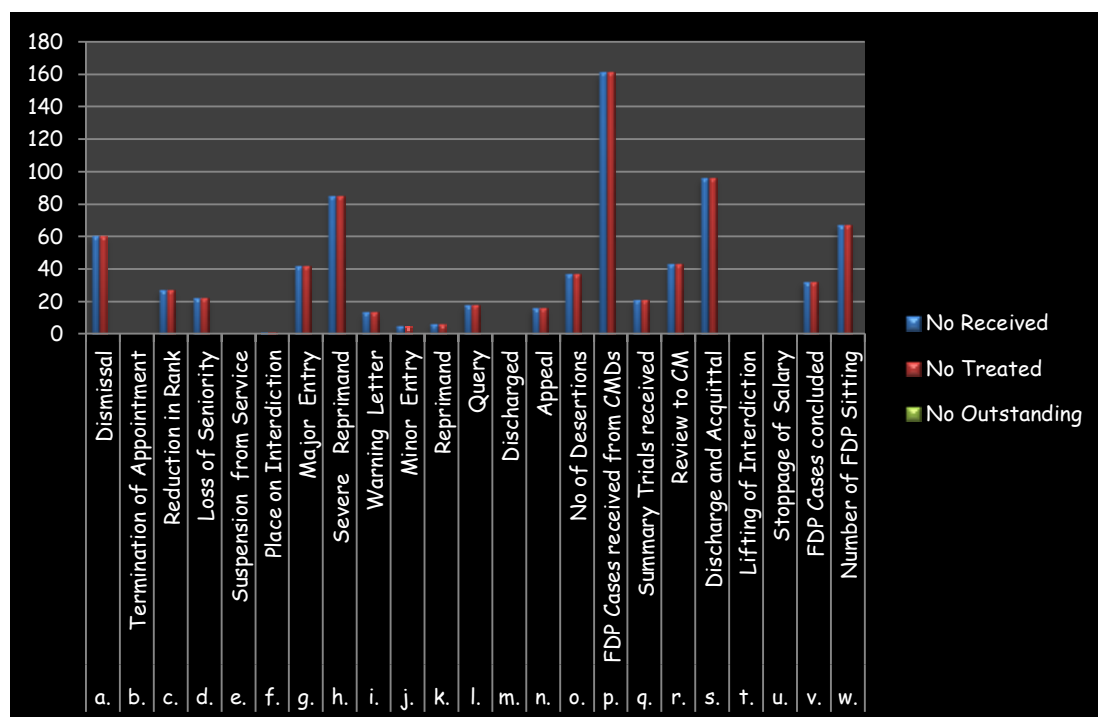

Chart 5: Chart Illustrating Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Officers)

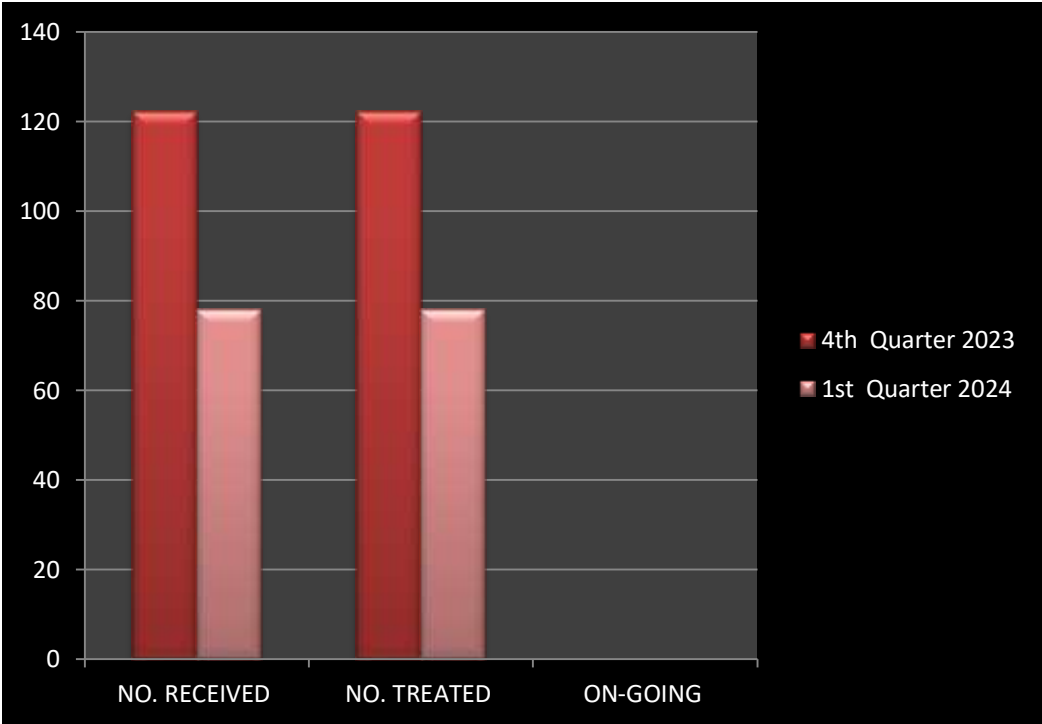

Chart 6: Incoming Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Marshals)

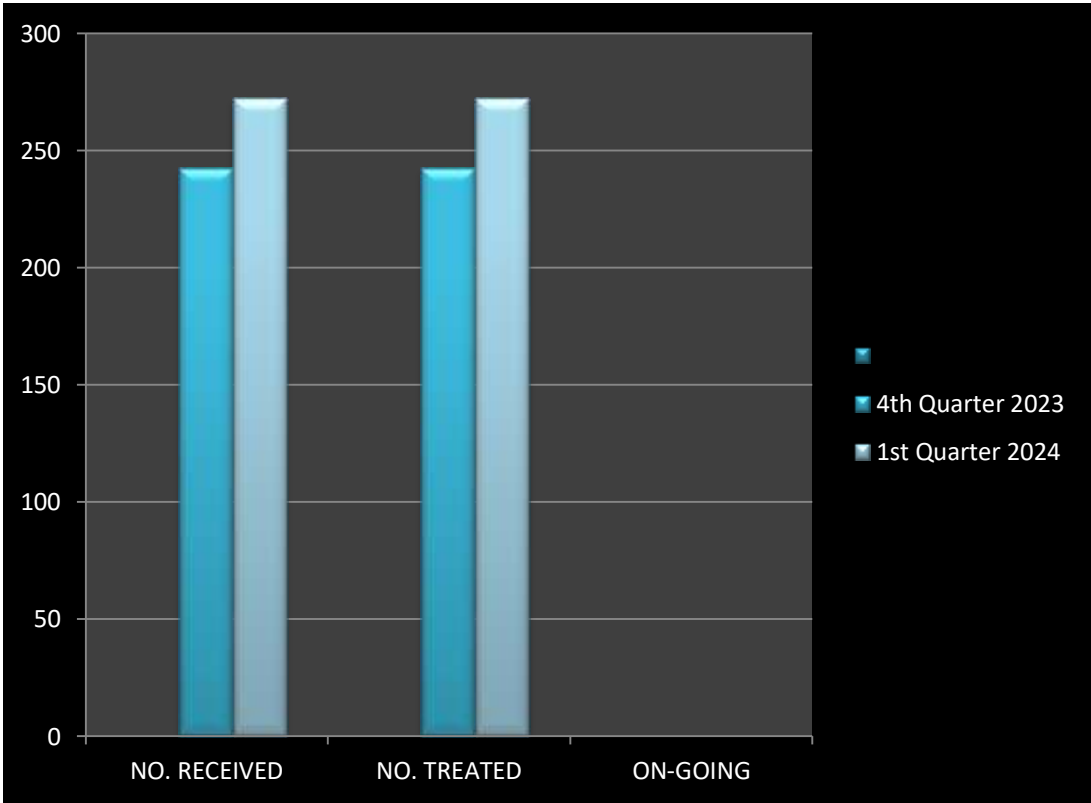
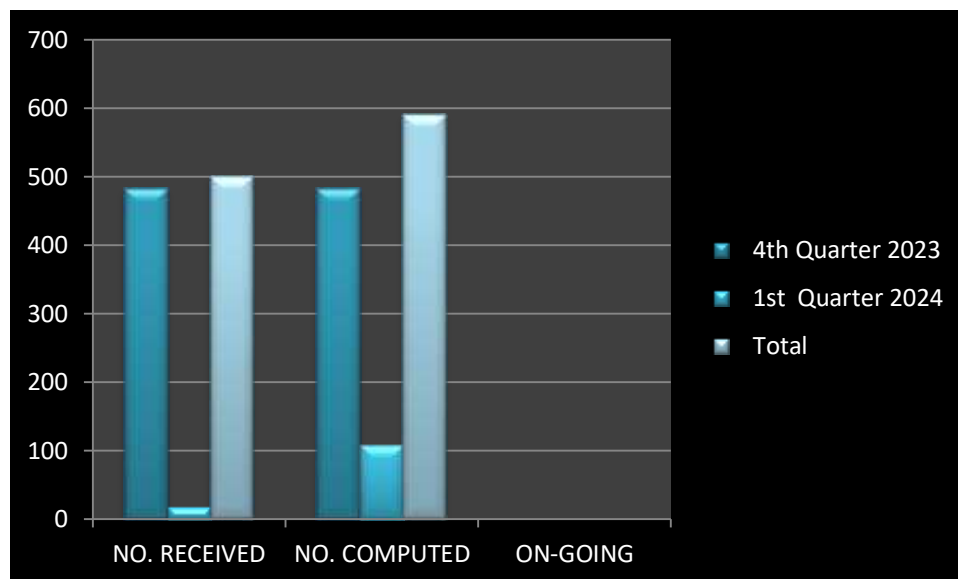

Chart 8: National Driver License production

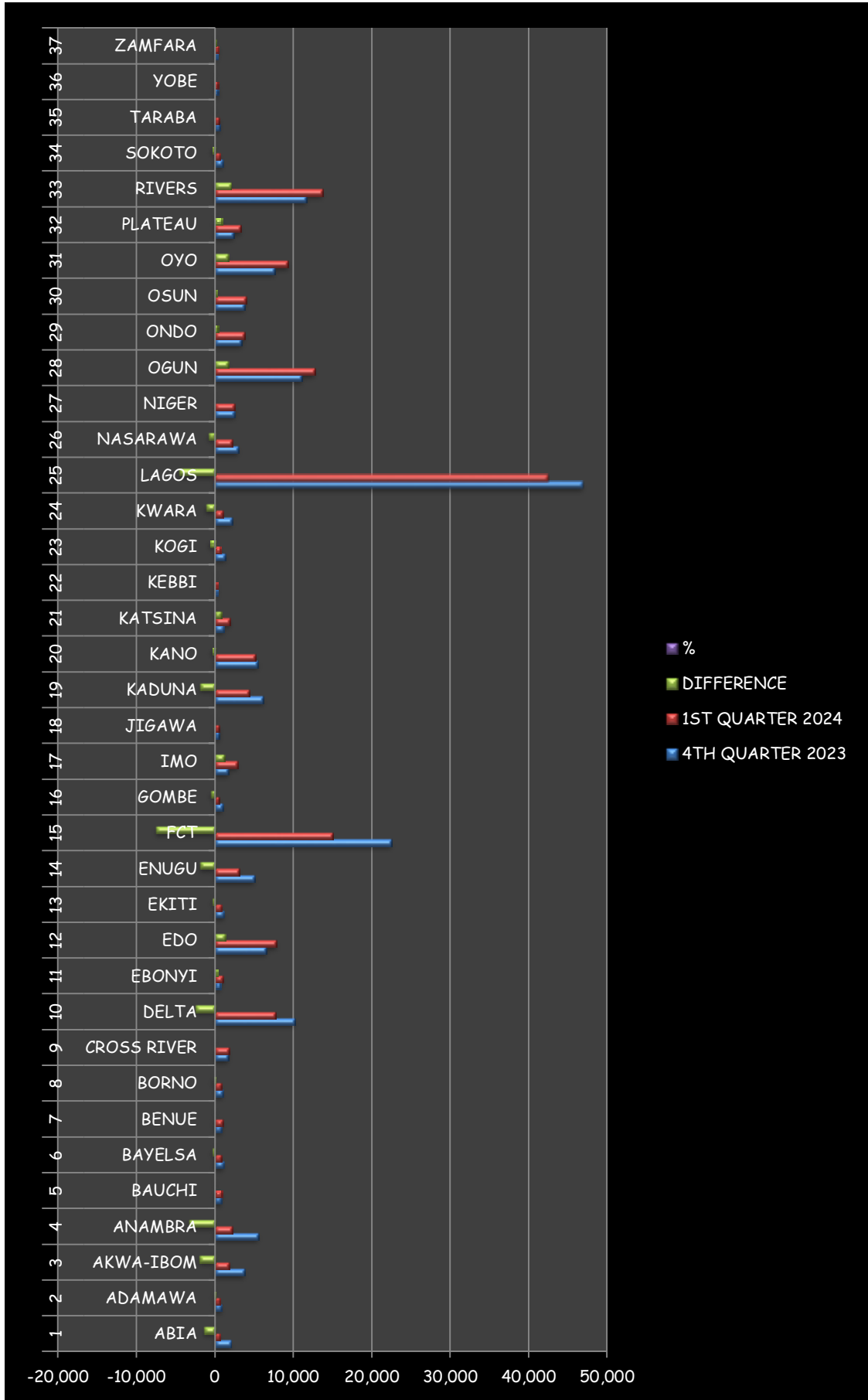
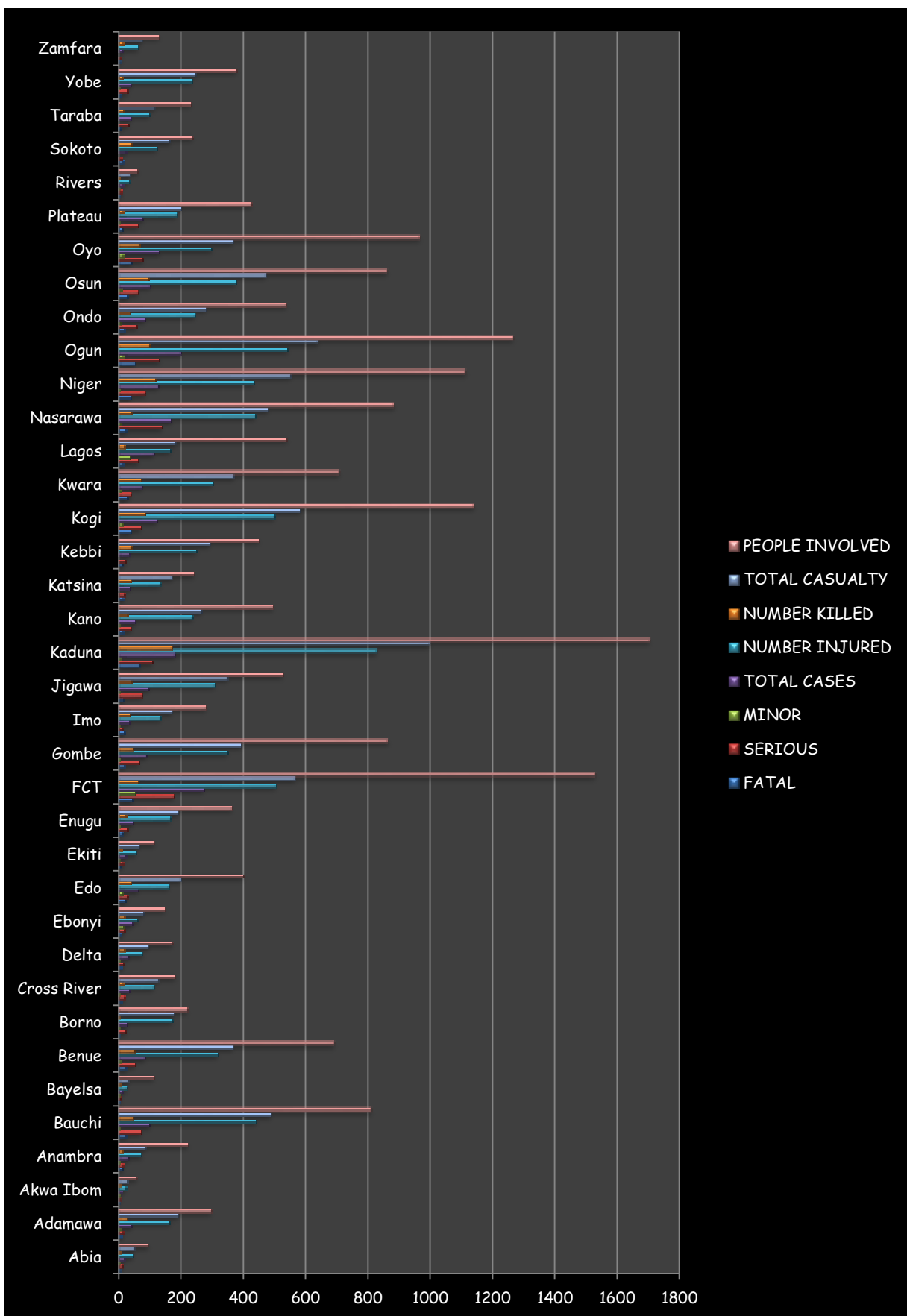

Chart 10: Partnership Analysis of Government Agencies and NGO

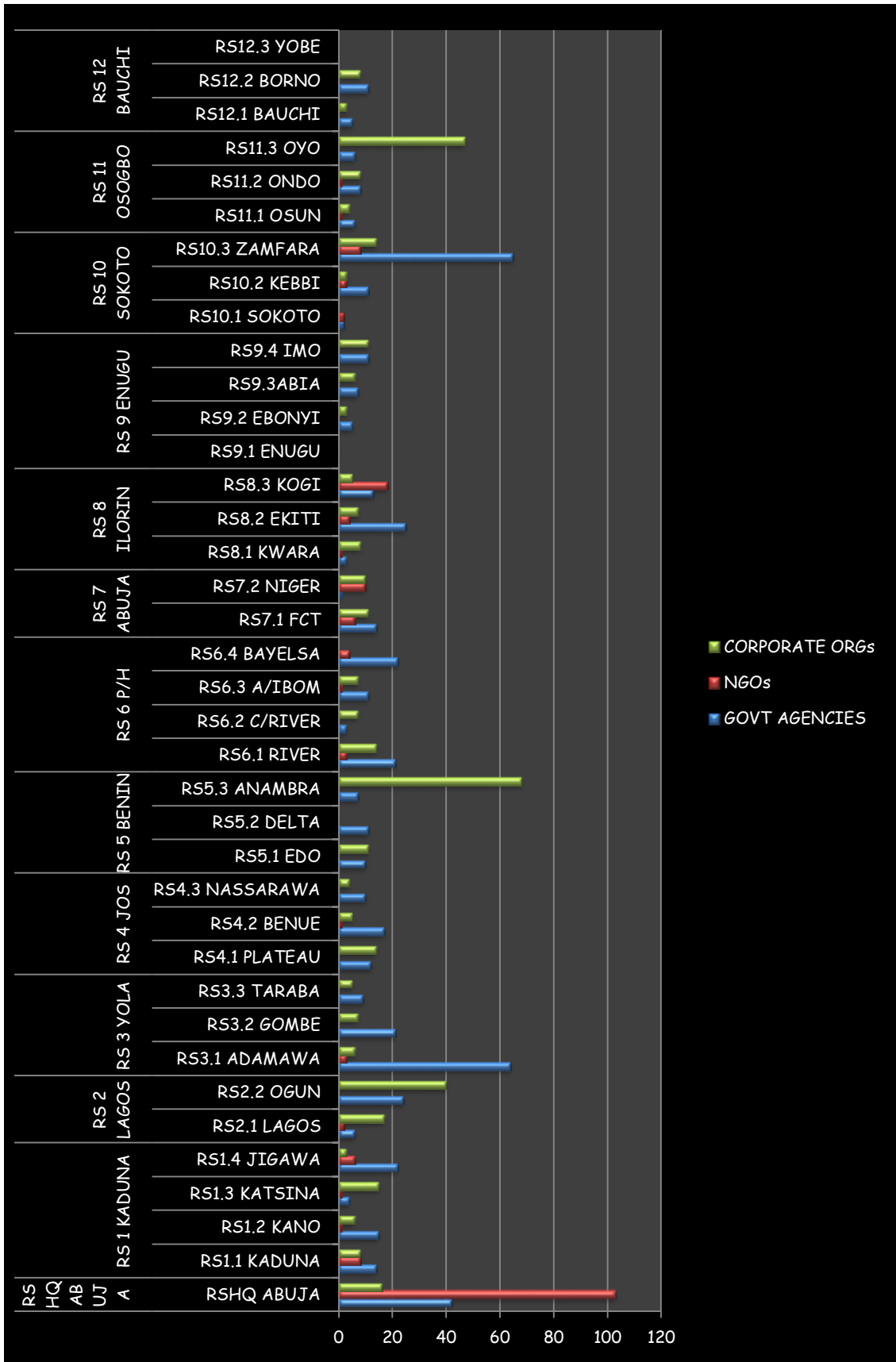

Chart 11 : Activities for 1st Quarter 2024

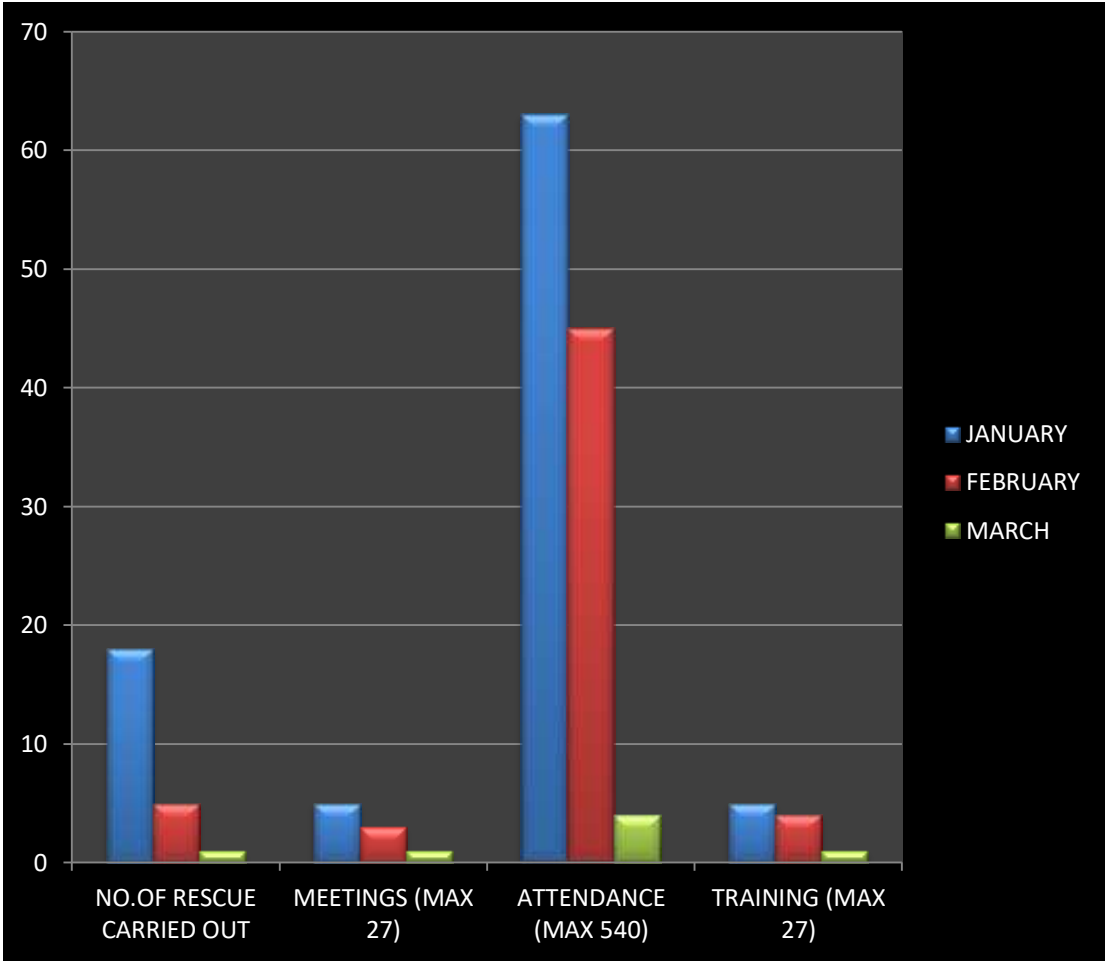

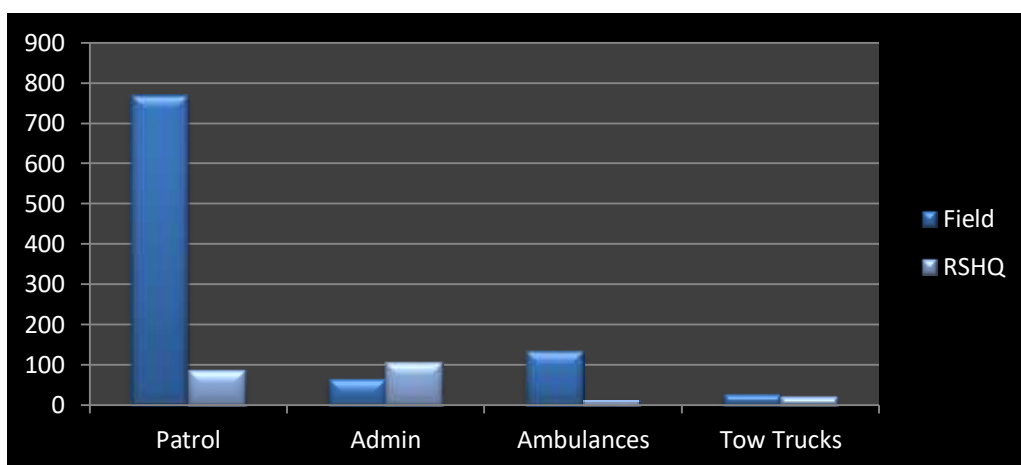

Chart 12: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients Attended to

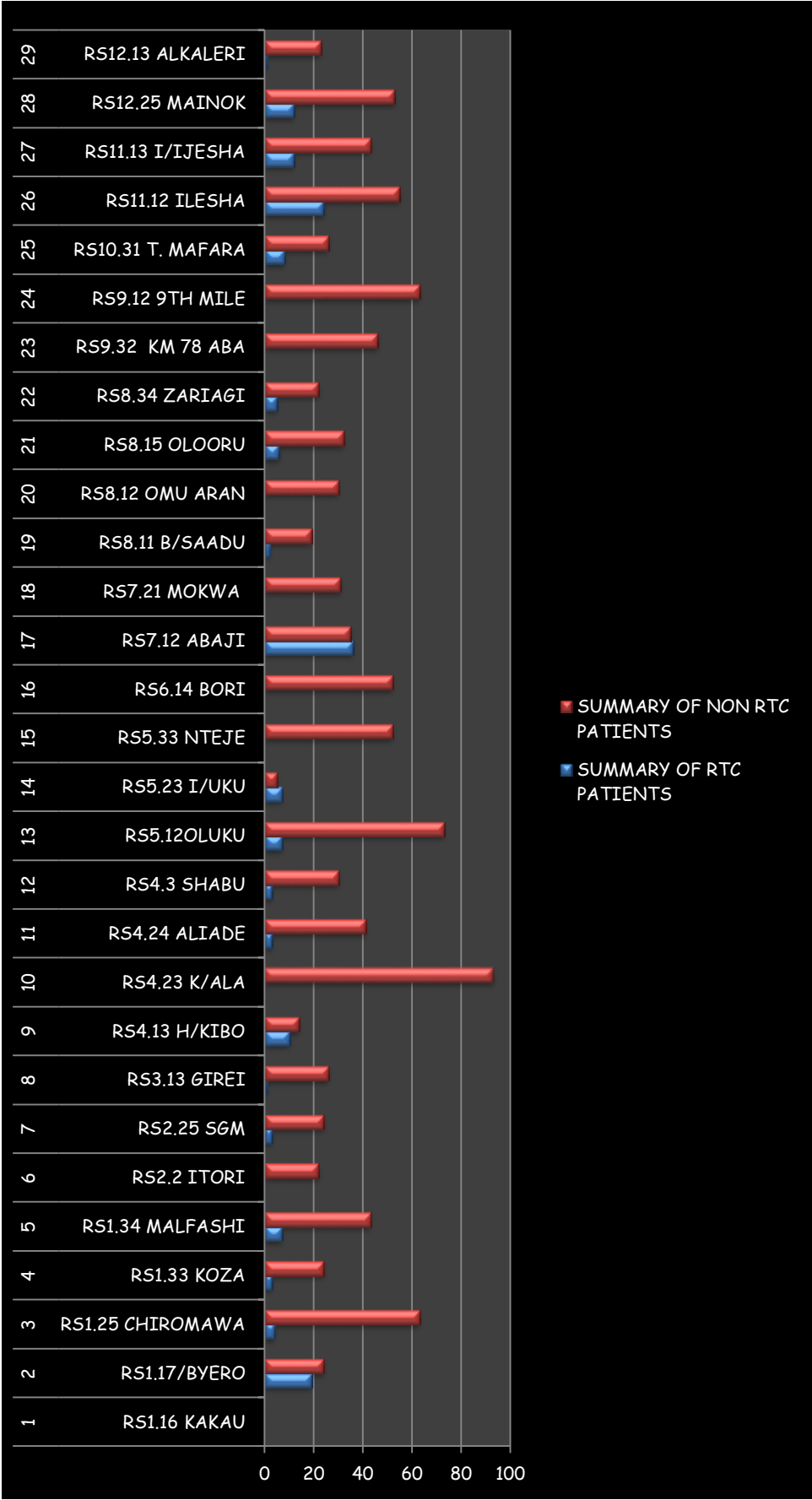

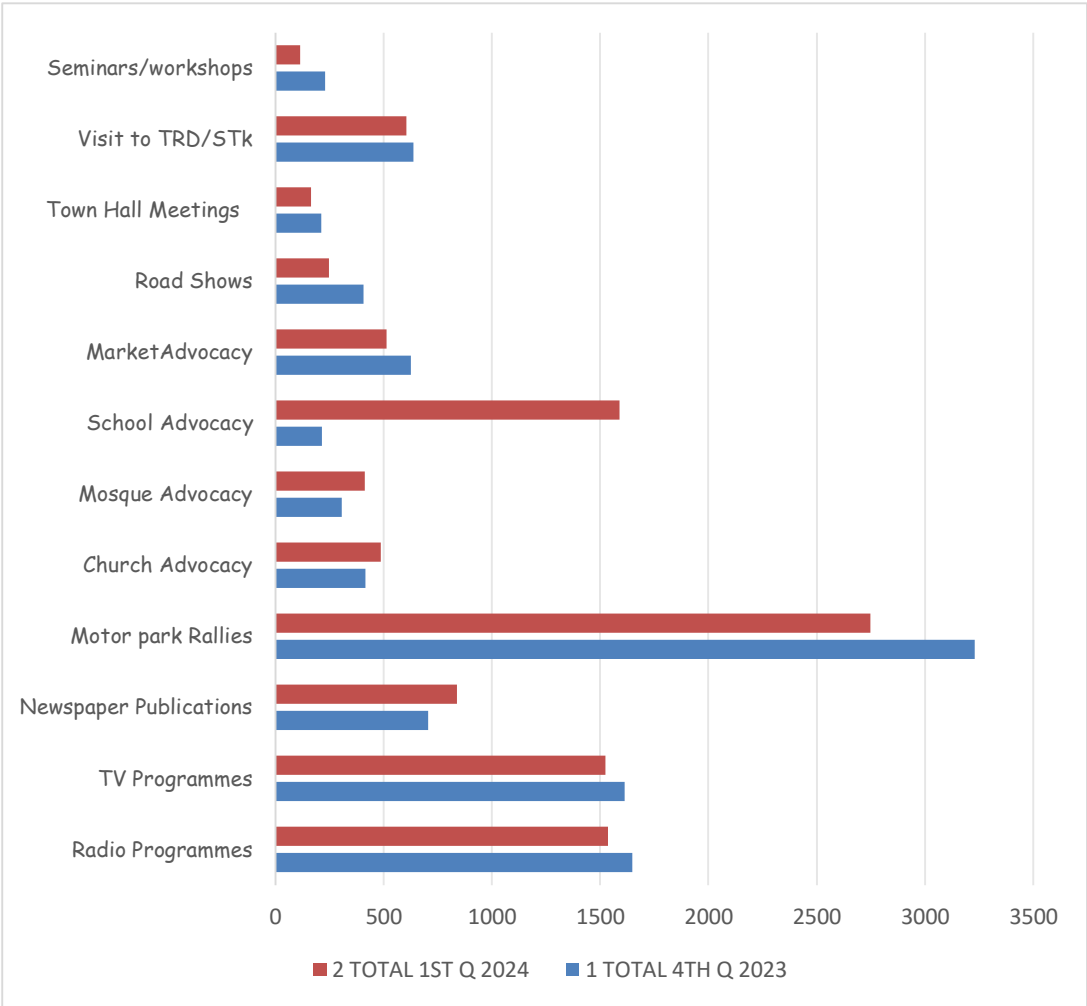

Chart 14: Summary Of Road Traffic Crashes Involving Fleet Operators

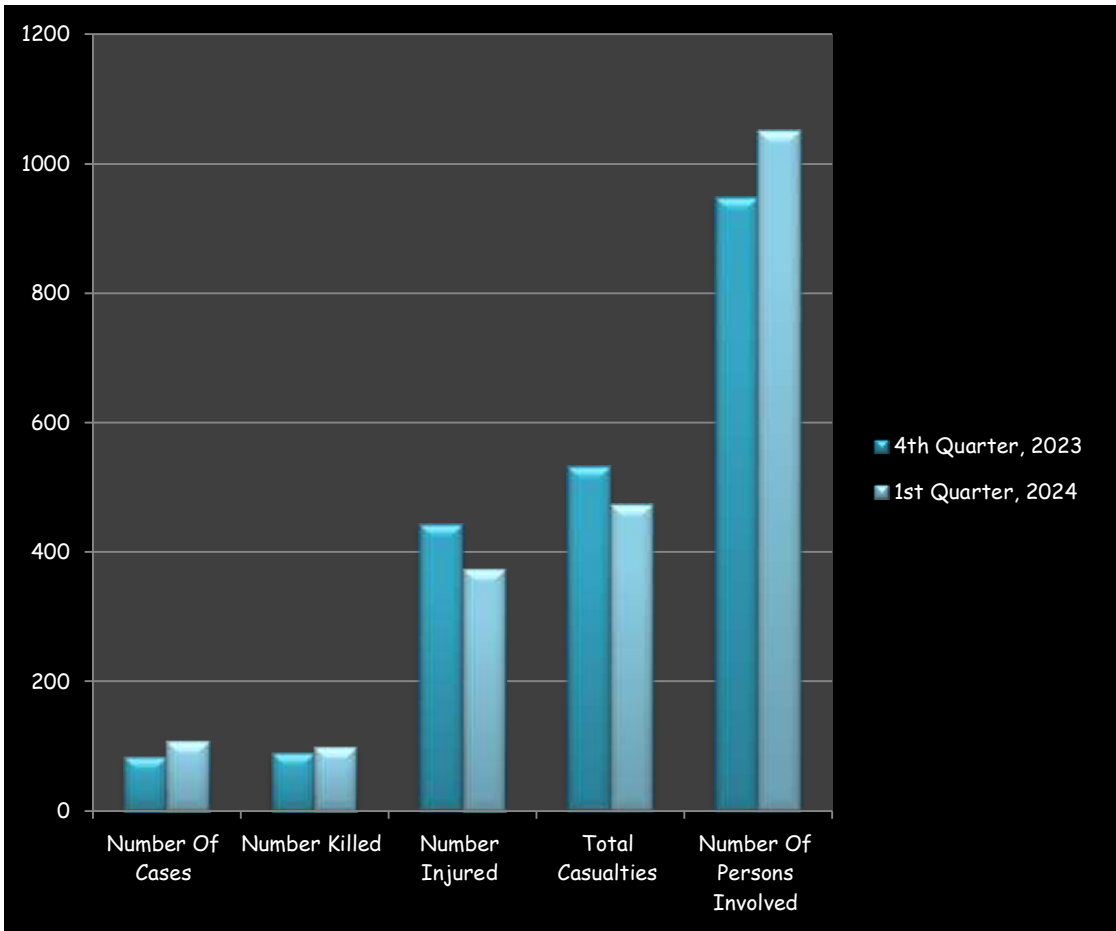


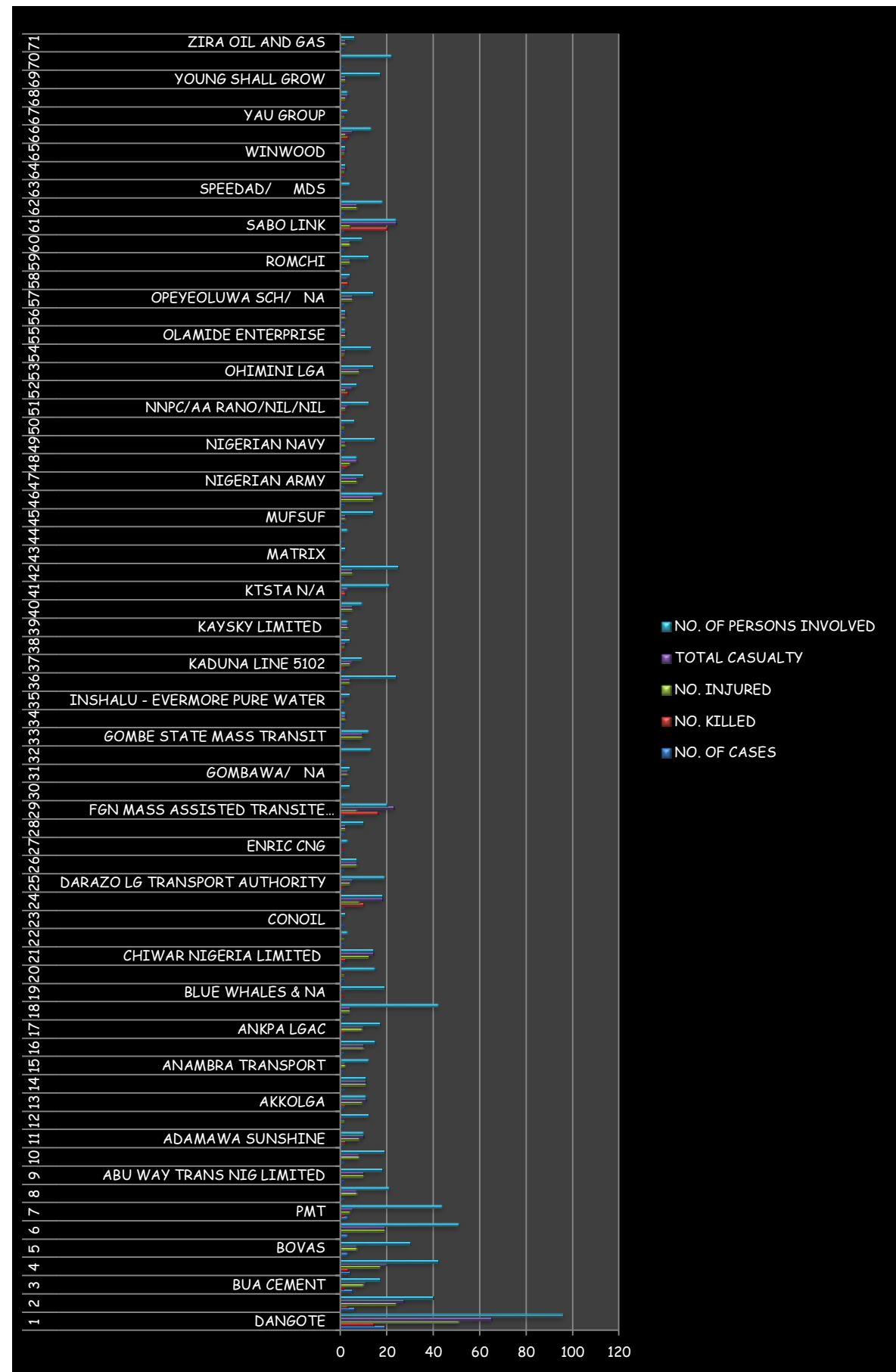

Chart 15: Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators



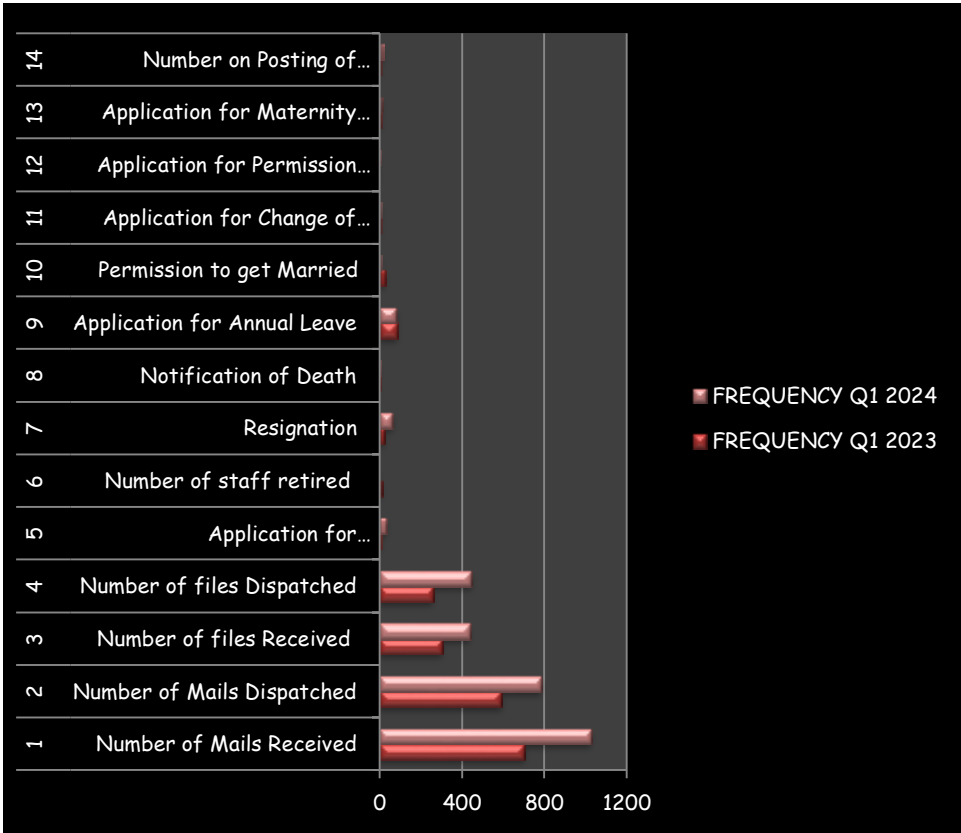

Chart 16: Corps Secretary Activities

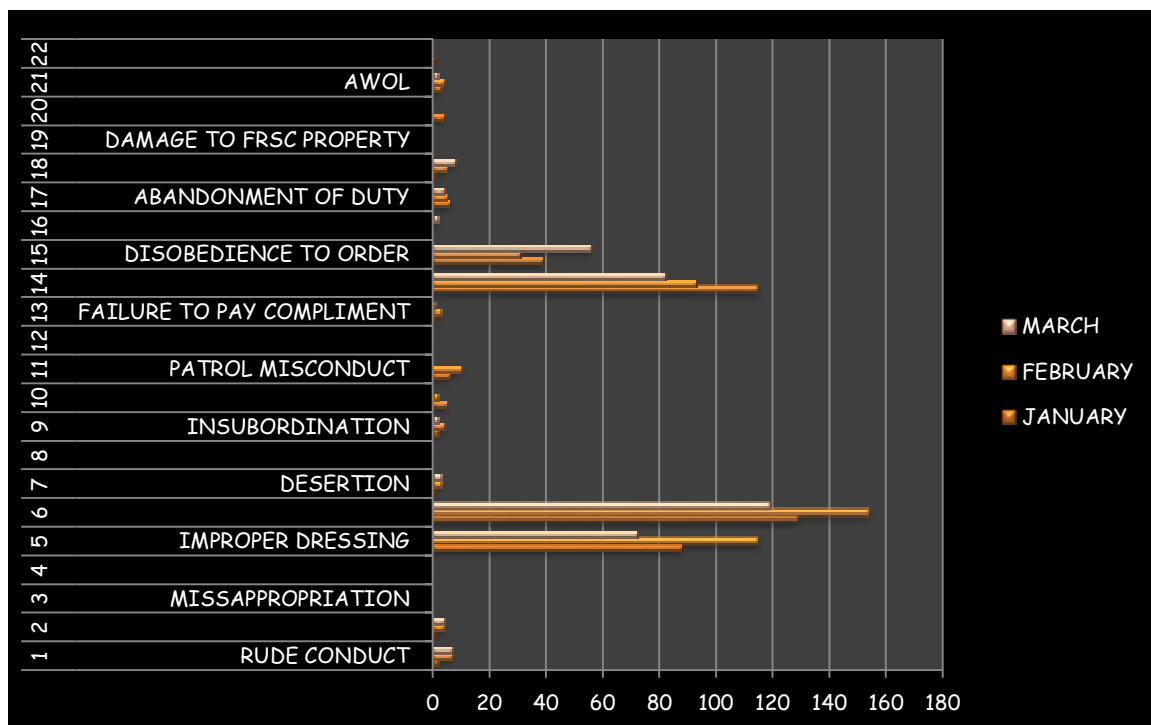

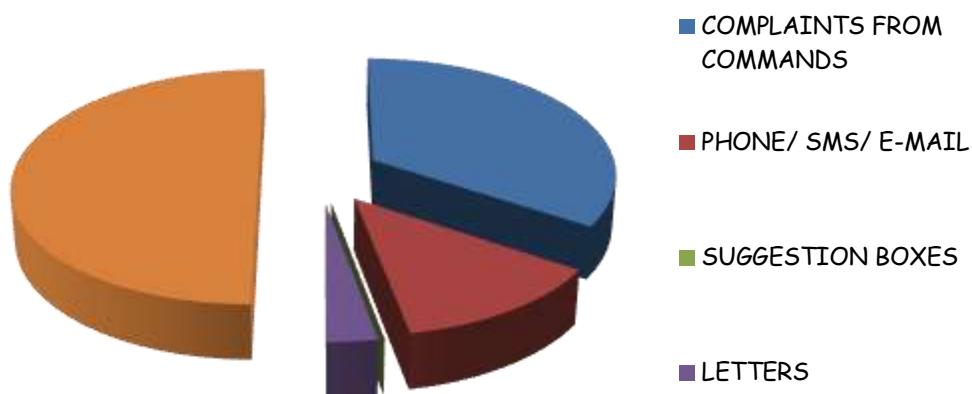

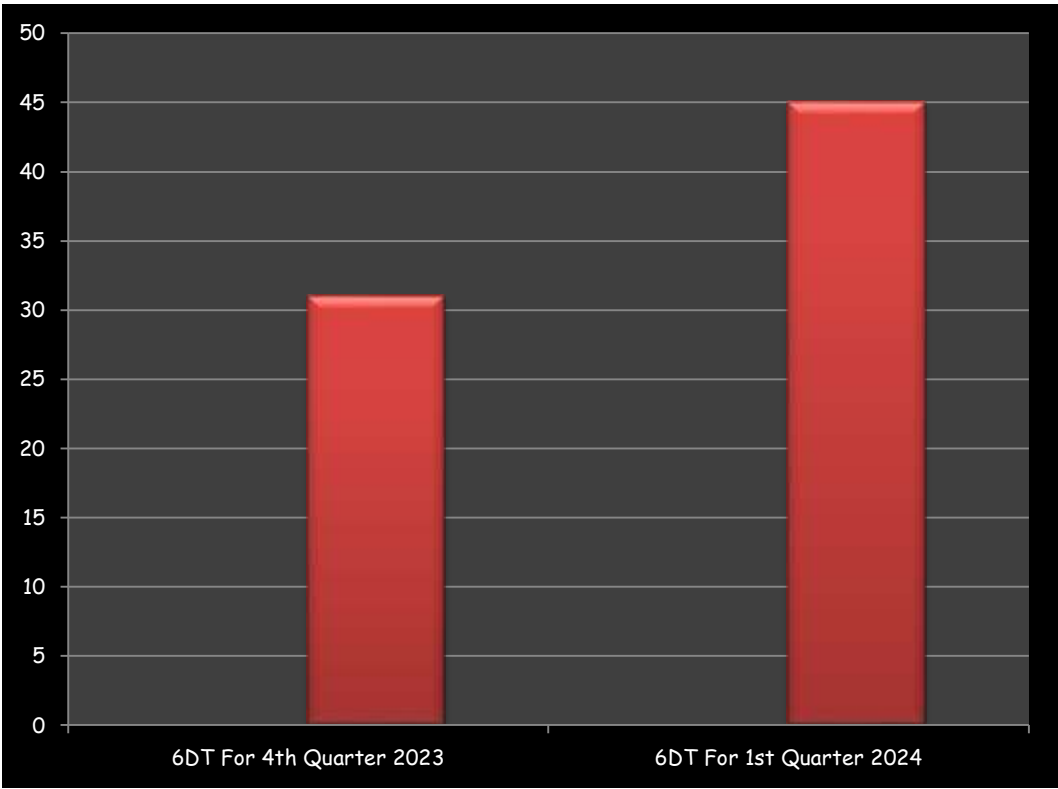
